RE: Follow up to Norcross site visit on September 29, 2004

Dear Ms. Webb:

I am writing to you as a follow up to the site visit on September 29, 2004, by staff members Steven Moffson, Architectural Historian, and Jenny Freemyer, Survey and Register Specialist. Based on their site visit, the log cabin, which is identified as noncontributing in the 1980 National Register documentation, should be considered contributing as an excellent example of a New Deal-era community building. If it must be relocated either to the intersection of Hwy 141 and South Peachtree Street or Dodson Park, it will still be considered contributing within the National Register listed Norcross Historic District (listed November 2, 1980).

The four houses along Wingo Street are already identified as contributing properties in the Norcross Historic District National Register nomination. Contributing properties within historic districts have the same benefits and recognition as individually listed properties and we suggest that every attempt be made to preserve these houses as important examples of early- to mid-20th century residential architecture.

Also, the Norcross city cemetery appears to be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. If the city is interested in pursuing a National Register nomination, I have enclosed a copy of our Historic Property Information Form to complete and return to our office.
