**Ordinance No. 07-2007**

**An Amendment to the City Code of Ordinances**

**CHAPTER AND PURPOSE.** Chapter 86, Buildings and Building Regulations.

**ENACTING CLAUSE.** The Council of the City of Norcross, Georgia, Hereby ordains that the adopted Code of Ordinances, is hereby amended as more particularly set forth herein. It is the intention of the Mayor and the Council, and it is hereby ordained that the following provisions shall become and be made a part of the Code of the City of Norcross, and the Sections of the Code in the Ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish that intention.

Section 86-107(d) of the Code shall be amended to read:

No house, dwelling, or commercial structure designated as historically significant which is located within the district listed on the National Register of Historic Places can be demolished without first having a public hearing before the mayor and council. The council shall vote to approve or deny the request to demolish, and shall use the standards of the adopted Architectural and Site Design Standards of the City to evaluate the request.
